TECH UPDATE WITH JIM SANDERS

To Be or Not To NRB

THAT is the question! If you were at NRB and in our suite, you heard the most frequent topic of conversation was the subject of **customized programs on Amb-OS**. There's been a dramatic increase in the number of ministries providing content with your station information (call letters, logo/brand, frequency) in the body of the program, voiced by the host. It's automatic and happens every day!

This feature has always been on the Amb-OS design path, but it's just been in the last year or so that an increasing number of ministries are taking advantage of this feature. The latest UI and firmware are required to make sure it works for you.

To Not NRB, But Maybe NAB

If we didn't see you at NRB, maybe we'll run into you at NAB (Las Vegas, April 22-27). And, if you go, be sure to circle Monday night (the 24th) when we have our Christian Radio Technical Forum dinner. It's at 6:00PM at the Treasure Island buffet. Looking for something new to read? Here are several suggestions—we guarantee you won't be disappointed!

Hanifesto SOCIAL MEDIA Influence **Manifesto on Social Media Influence** has just been published, authored by Museum of the Bible's Director of Communications Jeremy Burton. The book helps set the standard for responsible use of the social web with 12 principles that will ensure that happens. A brief but powerful read!

MEET JEREMY: He's led efforts to reach millions of people through social media programs including making the Top 100 Social Media Colleges list. On the personal side, he is a kidney donor, has coached a gold medalist, and has held a world record for popping bubble wrap (yes, that's an official Guinness Book record). Fleeing Isis, Finding Jesus: The Real Story of God at Work is the latest from Haven's Charles Morris, co-authored with Craig Borlase. It's a deeply encouraging story of Muslims coming to faith—despite the rise of terrorism.
