

Celebrating a Milestone Anniversary

With a long history of leadership in the pro-life movement, J. C. ("Jack") Willke, M.D., founded Life Issues Institute in 1991—and with that, the launch of the short feature *Life Issues* as well.

For more than a decade, Dr. Willke was the voice of the daily 1:00 broadcast designed to help listeners understand the critical concerns of our day relative to advances—and challenges—in the effort to draw attention to issues impacting our value on the sanctity of human life.

Dr. Jack Willke and his wife, Barbara, were indefatigable global advocates on behalf of that message. Knowing

the work would continue long past his ability to sustain the efforts, Dr. Willke passed the *Life Issues* program hosting baton to **Brad Mattes** in 2003 and the organization's Board of Directors elected Brad President of the Life Issues Institute in 2015.

Today under the leadership of Brad Mattes, Life Issues Institute continues to elevate its mission to encourage, educate and support those who recognize the right to life through creation and distribution of resources, through media channels (including the daily feature and a three-time Emmy Award winning TV series), and every avenue available.

WHO GETS TO CHOOSE?





Understanding the process, and choosing life in the midst of medical procedures and more, is a clear call for believers committed to the sanctity of life.








TOP TEN READING LIST lisa Anderson

We hope you're enjoying this series on recommended reading by the speakers we serve. This week, Focus on the Family's Lisa Anderson shares what she calls "an eclectic list of great books, in no particular order"—exactly what we love to see!

- 1. The Gospel for Real Life (Jerry Bridges) The gospel isn't only for the unbeliever; it's for me, too. Every single day. Thanks to this book, I finally understand why those goats in Leviticus met their particular fates.
- Bruchko (Bruce Olson) The story of a man with a mission to the Motilone Indians. An amazing account of courage and desire to follow wherever God leads. Bonus: includes a nasty tapeworm.
- 3. The Scarlet Pimpernel (Baroness Emmuska Orczy) Adventure and intrigue set during the French Revolution. A fun caper for which you also get smarty-pants credit because it's considered classic literature.
- 4. Thriving at College (Alex Chediak)
 The best book I've read on
 navigating the entire college
 experience, from grades to free time
 to money to relationships.
- 5. Marry Him: The Case for Settling for Mr. Good Enough (Lori Gottlieb) A compelling argument for why many of us are still single. Secular worldview and some language aside, this book is spot-on and masterfully written.

- 6. Keep Your Love On (Danny Silk)
 To love like Jesus, we need to
 end toxic cycles of behavior, draw
 boundaries, and start relating in a
 mature and heart-filled way toward
 others. Danny actually makes it
 seem possible.
- 7. Young and in Love (Ted Cunningham) Pastor Ted Cunningham's honest and often hilarious case for why marrying young makes a lot of sense for Christian young adults.
- 8. The Hundred Dresses (Eleanor Estes) A children's book about a shabbily-dressed girl who brags that she has one hundred dresses at home, and is bullied mercilessly as a result. The tear-inducing ending reveals the truth.
- 9. Because He Loves Me (Elyse Fitzpatrick) If we really believed that God loves us unconditionally, it would change the way we live. Bonus: My mom-friends also rave about her parenting book, Give Them Grace.
- 10. Stiff: The Curious Lives of Human Cadavers (Mary Roach) — This book is just crazy awesome. Ever wonder what happens (or can happen) to our bodies postmortem? Wonder no more.








Christmas is coming! Here are a few more books we'd suggest you consider for gifting this season:











Divine Opportunity— Finding God in the Conversations of Everyday Life (Ryan Montague) Ryan (professor of

communication at Azusa Pacific University) profiles inspiring stories and provides practical tips for transforming disengagement into meaningful, lifechanging conversations by recognizing divine promptings and looking for "God moments" in everyday interactions.

Chosen for Greatness: **How Adoption Changes** the World (Paul Batura)

Paul Batura (VP/ Communications at Focus on the Family) shares the life stories of 16 well-known adoptees (including Steve Jobs, Nelson Mandela and George Washington Carver). Paul and his wife, Julie, have had the privilege of adopting their three sons at birth so speak enthusiastically from personal experience Shawn's journey to on behalf of adoption.

All But Normal—Life on Victory Road (Shawn **Thornton**) This personal memoir is a gripping reminder that every person's life is a uniquely woven tapestry of grace. As senior pastor at Calvary Community Church (Westlake CA) and speaker for All Things New, one might assume Shawn Thornton's life was never with challenge. Think again as you read wholeness in Christ.

Remember & Return— **Rekindling Your Love** for the Savior (John MacArthur) In the busyness of today's world, it can be all too easy to lose our first love, as Paul admonished the church at Ephesus. Here's a helpful 31day devotional that moves the reader "from understanding to application to reflection and prayer," with the goal of rekindling what's most important—our first love for Christ.

Kingdom Citizen (Tony Evans) Could there be a more ideal season for understanding our calling as citizens—citizens of the Kingdom of God? As Christians struggle to understand their role in reversing the downward spiral of our national convictions. Dr. Tonv Evans, in partership with Focus on the Family, offers a healthy dose of hope—a solution that means every one of us has a vital role to play as Kingdom Citizens.




Where Christmas Never Ends
