DO YOU KNOW MARTIN LUTHER?

"How great is the peril of a bishop if he permits the gospel to be kept quiet..."

Martin Luther (1483-1546) was born on November 10 in Eiselben, Germany. In 1505 he became an Augustinian friar. By 1517 he wrote his 95 Theses outlining his concerns with the indulgences being sold by the church. In so doing he ignited what has become known as the Protestant Reformation—one result of which was to make the Bible accessible to common people.

QUESTION OF THE MONTH

In honor of Grandparent's Day (September 10), what life lesson did your grandparent teach you?

My maternal grandparents personified grace. They taught me basic, biblical right and wrong, and skills for being productive. But they primarily taught me, along with my mother, who Jesus is, what God had done for me through Jesus, and through the gift of faith, I could not lose His love or forgiveness. This was particularly reassuring as one of many adopted grandchildren in their family. They literally fed the less fortunate families in their town. They helped build others' houses and barns, demanded respect for all persons of all races and backgrounds, and had a strong personal work ethic. And...never an evening went by without all who were in their house sitting together in the living room to hear one of them read from the scriptures and end that time with prayer and words of deep love for Jesus and those in the room.

Without question my grandparents taught me, largely through simply the way they lived their lives, the value of hard work, dedication, family stability, and the joy of using your hands to create things. Married to their original spouses their entire lives, one grandfather worked as a commercial artist for the same company for 29 years until his retirement, and was an incredible watercolor painter and woodworker in his spare time. Another served in World War II and labored much of his life in the oil fields. One grandmother was always creating the most intricate cross-stitches, and another was a hospital volunteer for as long as I can remember.

At 18 years old, I sat across the table from my godly grandmother, Ruth Bahls. It was in that moment where I realized the great wisdom in her words. I thought, if only I could take her brain and place it in my body. Of course, that wasn't possible, but one phrase that she often said has been recalled throughout my life which reflected her contentment and trust in God's guidance of her life: "Bloom where you're planted." I'm thankful to my sweet grandmother who sewed seeds of trusting God, and who helped me join Him at His table that day . . . and forever more.

FORTY YEARS AGO, DENNIS AND BARBARA RAINEY

invited a group of fellow Crusade staffers to a study designed to anchor families in a biblical framework for marriage. The outgrowth of that became a global ministry that included the HomeBuilders course and the Weekend to Remember conferences.

Knowing that the material needed to be shared even more widely, the daily FamilyLife Today program launched in November 1992, ultimately companioned with short feature and weekend broadcasts. Later a video

series (The Art of Marriage) was developed—and it will be bookended in just a few months with a corollary series, The Art of Parenting.

All along the way, Dennis and Barbara have modelled a faithful approach to serving the Kingdom. They continue to do so with the announcement of anticipated transitions ahead. The FamilyLife board has announced appointment of a new president for the ministry effective December 1.

David Robbins will step into this CEO position although Dennis will continue to be heard on-air with co-host Bob Lepine. The opportunity to model

God-honoring "passages" has been vigorously embraced by both Dennis and David.

We look forward to further introducing station partners to David and his wife, Meg, in the days ahead (including at NRB)—especially as we celebrate the 25 years of *FamilyLife Today* in a couple months. In the meantime, please pray for the team at FamilyLife ... and for Christ to be glorified each step of the way!
