Murphy Rules

We've been growing here at Amb-OS (as you likely know from reading this column). And the consequence was a project to install a whole new patch bay system. Very exciting! I love getting a soldering iron in my hands. However, as Murphy would prescribe, just as the last solder joint cooled, someone on our team cautiously suggested we consider an Audio-Over-IP network instead of an analogue patch bay.

Even though I personally had a few dozen hours into the project, I had to laugh because in the end, I'm excited to enjoy the flexibility of AOIP.

You may know Ken Van Prooyen who has been of supreme help in evaluating and designing the right system for us. So I'm pleased to announce we've chosen Wheatstone's system of blades and software. While Wheatstone is clearly the best fit for us, it's no question that any of the alternative AOIP systems would work far better than relying on an analogue patch panel that's subject to dirty contacts and bad solder joints! Happy days ahead for us!

(BTW – If you have a need for a ¼" patch bay, lemme know. I'm happy to send along our uninstalled bays!)

◀ LEE ANN REPORTS ON MEDIA SUMMIT IN EGYPT

Imagine selfie-taking teens juxtaposed with five thousand years of history—that's Egypt! Privileged to be part of an international team hosted by Ron Harris, President of MEDIAlliance, our two-day media training in Cairo included 50 people from six ministries involved in Christian media in the Middle East.

My takeaways?

First—the youth are very friendly ... my face is now included in a number of selfies taken by young Egyptians anxious to be seen with tourists!

Second—Cairo is chaos! A city of 9.5 million, it is the fourth largest metropolis in the world! And traffic? No one uses the painted lanes on the roads. Horns are constantly honking. People jump in and out of old VW buses in the middle of the road. And that road is being shared by everything from cars to buses to donkey carts. (I did ride a camel but that was in the desert!)

Most importantly—as I led Social Media sessions and interacted with attendees, hearts resonated with a mutual conviction and commitment to share the Gospel. One young woman (my translator) exhorted "be anointed"—what great marching orders for my own life!


Tom Bedson
