





These are, in rank order, the most popular passwords used today. And I particularly love number 10 on this list . . . as though typing the series backwards would fool anyone.

I hope your password isn't on this list. If it is, it's time to install a great password manager like LastPass (lastpass.com). It'll complete web forms for you, provide strong passwords you don't have to remember and is portable to other platforms. It will remember hundreds of your passwords in a highly secure environment.

Well, much to our chagrin, up until recently, our FTP site was accessed by a single username and password. That makes things convenient, but isn't terribly secure. Anyone who had the combination could grab files from our FTP without much restriction.

But that old system is now long gone. Every station/user has a unique username and password, which permissions programs on a user-by-user basis. The same combination will allow you to manage your FTP permissions. Start with your User ID and Password and then browse to <http://ftp-permissions.amb-os.com>. 

48 Hours with Revive Our Hearts

Ambassador's Jennifer Perez (Media Strategist for Revive Our Hearts) recently spent time in Michigan at headquarters for Nancy DeMoss Wolgemuth's radio ministry. What a trip! My visit to Niles, Michigan (by way of Chicago) to meet with the team at Revive Our Hearts was a summer highlight, and as **Nancy DeMoss Wolgemuth** regularly prays, it was a time where God granted me "fresh oil." While we experienced the heat (and humidity) of summertime in "Michiana," my time there certainly wouldn't be described as "lazy days." In fact, there are lots of things happening at the ministry!

Day One included a full day of meetings where I spent time with their production team and strategy sessions with ROH leadership (Phil Krause, Tom Mathis, Hugh Duncan) (1) along with representatives from Douglas Shaw & Associates. We also enjoyed a serendipitous surprise visit from Jim Schneider (President/VCY America-Milwaukee) with wife, Faith, and son, Matthew, who stopped by while traveling in the area (2).




TRUE WOMAN '18 UPDATE

How to Give Away Your Faith

Paul Little

Right out of college, I went into youth ministry. This little (sic) book in 1973, was a lifesaver. Just the basics of personal evangelism.

Where Is God When It Hurts?

Philip Yancey

After youth ministry, my first “real” job in 1976, was with Campus Life Magazine, working with Philip Yancey. He became one of my close friends (and still is) and favorite authors (and still is).

The Lost Art of Disciple Making

LeRoy Eims

In 1981, Mike Hyatt became an employee and friend (and still is). Then he became the co-founder of the company I now lead. He introduced me to LeRoy Eims. A powerful, memorable book.

Born Again | Chuck Colson

Published in 1976, this breakout bestseller surprised everyone.

The Holiness of God | R.C. Sproul

My roots are pure Mennonite. Card-carrying Wesleyans. Good things there to be sure. But

this book introduced me to a concept I had missed growing up...the pure holiness of our Creator...and the reason to live in holiness... not because it's my ticket to heaven but rather my privilege and joy here and now.

Fearfully and Wonderfully Made

Philip Yancey and Paul Brand

Back to this author again...right before this book went to press, Philip called to tell me about the book he had just finished. When I asked the title, he said, “The Body Revealed.” I thought he could do better and made a suggestion from Psalm 139. He liked it. I team taught this book in the 90s with a medical doctor. Really loved the way it impacted my students as it had impacted me.

Lies Women Believe

Nancy DeMoss Wolgemuth

Okay, okay...shamelessly prejudiced here. But I read this book when Nancy and I were dating. Then I sat with her on our deck in the summer of 2017 as she re-wrote it. It's Nancy's bestselling book. And for good reasons.


Just Do Something | Kevin DeYoung

GET TO KNOW

Phil Johnson

is Executive Director of **Grace to You**, the media ministry of **John MacArthur**. In addition to leading GTY and also being the editor for John's major books for nearly 40 years, Phil has also recently stepped into the role of announcer/host for the *Grace to You* radio broadcast. We invite you to get to know the new voice heard on nearly 900 outlets nationwide!

Tell us how you first learned about Jesus.

I grew up going to a liberal church, so I heard a lot about Jesus from my earliest childhood, but I had never really been taught the gospel. About a month before I graduated from high school, I was sensing a great spiritual void in my life, so I picked up a Bible, opened it at random, and started reading. I'd never read more than a verse or two of Scripture at once.

1 Corinthians 1 is not where you'd send a high school student looking for the gospel, but the dawn of true understanding started for me with that chapter: Paul's condemnation of human wisdom, wealth, power, and arrogance in those opening chapters, combined with his elevation of the gospel as something that sounds uselessly unsophisticated to the worldly wise—a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Greeks. Within a week, God providentially exposed me to clear presentations of the gospel three more times. It was as if everything in my life suddenly conspired to make the truth of Scripture clear to me. And by the end of that week, I had become a believer.

Your relationship with John MacArthur is a long one—how did that connection get made originally?

The first time I heard him was in 1977. I had never even heard his name, and I was pretty sure nothing good could come out of California. From the time John MacArthur began teaching, I was transfixed. The message wasn't just recycled platitudes that I'd heard before. He actually opened the Bible and taught from it. During that very first message, it occurred to me that John's material was so rich, he needed to be writing books.

A few years later, I spent the next 18 months editing John MacArthur's sermons

for a couple of Moody Press books. John must have liked my work, because he invited me to come to California and join the GTY staff. That was 1983 and I've been here ever since. The thrill of it has never worn off. I have this deep sense that I'm doing exactly what I was born to do.

As you've been closely engaged in working with John's materials and writing for ministry, what do you most appreciate about the relationship?

His discipline and single-minded stamina still amaze me. I'm thankful for his mentorship, encouragement, and patience. For someone who is as steadfast and clear-cut as he is in the pulpit, his personal dealings with people are always profoundly gracious. I love him for that, and he is a joy to work with.

You and Darlene have been married for 40 years. How did you meet?

We celebrated our 40th anniversary June 10. We met when she came to work at Moody Press. It really was a case of love at first sight. I invited her to a Cubs' game within 10 minutes of meeting her. That was our first date. There's a brick in the sidewalk at Wrigley with our names and the date and score of that first game we watched together. She's a fanatical Cubs fan to this day.

You now have three grown sons. What do you hope they learned best from your example as a dad?

Obviously, I hope they learned what it means to be devoted to Christ and His truth and to make that the center from which all their affections and all their convictions radiate. In practical, family terms, I hope they learned the same thing that was the best lesson I learned from my dad: How to love your wife.

And now you're also a grandfather—what do you love best about this season?

They're a thousand times more fun than having your own kids because you don't have the same responsibility to discipline and correct them. You can hand them back to their parents when they need that, and all you have to do is shower them with love and encouragement. We're blessed in that all seven of our grandkids still live close by; they all still go to Grace Church, so we get to spend lots of time with them. It's impossible to state what a profound blessing they are. Psalm 128:6 speaks of grandchildren as the pinnacle of all earthly blessings. They make up for a lot of the pains and inconveniences that come with old age.

We're going to assume you might mention John MacArthur as a spiritual mentor but is there anyone else pivotal to your spiritual growth you'd want to name?

Warren Wiersbe influenced me greatly. He was the first true Bible expositor I ever heard. Wiersbe whetted my appetite for Scripture; John MacArthur taught me the difference between the milk of God's Word and meat. His teaching has given me a craving for teaching that is truly nourishing and deeply satisfying, rather than the cotton candy so many evangelicals settle for.

*You created a blog titled *Pyromaniacs* ... why that name?*

It's a reference to Jeremiah 23:29, where the Lord says, "Is not my word like fire?"
