TECH UPDATE FROM JIM SANDERS

Cascaded Transcoding Error. How's that for a scintillating title?! Actually, it comes up often as we talk with stations. On a recent call, I suggested that a station transfer files from their AMR-100 directly to their automation system. That keeps the digital files in their native domain and saves a ton of time and avoids Cascaded Transcoding Errors (CTE). The station had been playing files and then record-capturing audio in real time.

Aside from the advantage of quick file management, transferring files avoids yet another layer of transcoding—going from digital (Amb-OS) to analog and back to digital (automation system) when the playback/capture is used. Any time sample rate, sample frequency or compression algorithms are changed, artifacts and errors are introduced. Radio stations face this threat because of the multiplicity of their file and audio management systems like automation system to console to STL to transmitter.

Transcoding error is a result of three possible changes in the structure of a digital file. (That file could contain audio, video, a photograph.) The three variables are:

- Bit Rate: This reflects the number of bits that are captured per unit of time. Common rates are 8, 16, 24 or 96 bits. The higher the number of bits, the more accuracy is reflected from one sample to the next, but you pay a price in file size.
- Sample Frequency is the number of times per second a bit is captured. CD's historically were 44.1kHz as compared to Amb-OS and other satellite operators at 48kHz.
- Compression Algorithms are designed to reduce the size of a stored file based on, in audio's case, psychoacoutical modeling, discarding "unnecessary" audio. MP3 and FLAC are examples of perceptual coding schemes.

Once a file has been stored in a bit-rate reduced algorithm (like MP3), it's impossible to ever re-create the original audio. The more often the transcoding occurs, the more audio errors and artifacts are introduced. So we want to transcode audio as few times as possible.

What exactly does cascaded transcoding error sound like? You'll hear a metallic series of artifacts which particularly affect high frequencies. It sounds like distortion, but in a digital way.

Since radio stations have several potential layers of transcoding error before the analog signal is ever transmitted, we recommend file transfers in Amb-OS. (By the way, HD channels are even more subject to CTE because of their significant bit rate reduction algorithms to squeeze the HD signal onto their carrier).

TOP 10 BOOKS

Our founder has been a lifelong student of the Word ... and a voracious reader. We thought it was time to hear his picks for a "Recommended Reading" list. For us—well, we would recommend his book. I'm Trying to Number My Days, But I Keep Losing Count! is filled with encouragement and humor—something Al has made a hallmark for nearly ten decades. That and a love for Christian TV and radio!

When it comes to publications which I consider a "must" in my life, it's extremely difficult to keep the number to ten (so I'll cheat a little here and there).

A good study Bible HAS to be number one! In my opinion, there's nothing better or more practical than *The MacArthur Study Bible* (published by Thomas Nelson). It's available in everything from the NKJV to the NIV. The ESV is great, but, for me personally, I choose the NASB. This Study Bible has up-to-date notes, as well as practical and easy-to-understand commentaries throughout.

I like using *The Message*, by Eugene Peterson (NavPress) for the shading and nuances on popular verses. Keep in mind, though, I look at it as a paraphrase.

I can't do without a good hymn book. I try to memorize the ones I enjoy. Someday I expect to be in a hospital, and these are the words for my mind and heart. I like *Hymns for the Family of God*, but most any edition will do. Your church may not even use them anymore. I like everything from *Youth Sings*, to *Favorites*, to the three great Maranantha chorus books. And, for the backstories, don't overlook *Then Sings My Soul*, volumes one and two, by Robert Morgan.

Joni Eareckson Tada has written an absolute MUST, Heaven: Your Real Home. (I have her painting to go with it. I also love Joni and Ken's autobiography, simply titled that. If you have a sick friend, don't overlook the Beyond Suffering Bible with such comforting footnotes (Tyndale).

Chuck Swindoll's study of Philippians, appropriately titled, *Laugh Again*. And, I love his volume, simply titled, *Jesus*. (I'm hoping he has one coming on my favorite Bible book, "James.") His expositions are impeccable!

In 2011, Billy Graham wrote about, **Nearing Home** (Nelson). What a reunion he must have had with Ruth, Cliff and Bev! (I've got this one pretty well marked up!)

It was probably a dozen years or more ago that Moody published John MacArthur's, *The Vanishing Conscience*. It's more up-to-date than tomorrow's LA Times!

Always a solid challenge are books by Nancy DeMoss Wolgemuth, which is especially true with, *Brokenness*, *Surrender*, *Holiness*. I'm anxious to read her new one (*You Can Trust God to Write Your Story*), co-authored with her husband, Robert.

Hove ANY book by Max Lucado. I fell in love with his style 100 books ago, as I devoured, *Six Hours One Friday*. And now, I don't want to miss his latest, *How Happiness Happens*. (You shouldn't either!)

It was Dennis Rainey who challenged me years ago to pray daily, out loud, with Margaret, my bride of 72 years. You can't beat what he and Barbara have compiled in Moments Together for Couples.

Okay, okay, I also love a good mystery story. I don't understand, however, why writers feel they need to add four letter words to move along the narrative. It's frankly disgusting. In this genre, my favorites would be John Grisham, David Baldacci, and even James Patterson (his chapters are usually only three pages long).

DO's & DON'Ts of PODCASTING

Don't focus on the downloads.

Do focus on the content: Give listeners content they can't get anywhere else.

Don't rely on *one* social media platform.

Do develop specific content for each of the distinctive platforms: Create videos for YouTube, quote graphics for Instagram and articles for LinkedIn.

Don't underestimate the power of the written word.

Do give careful thought to your podcast name and use key words in your program description: SEO strategy is key when potential listeners are searching for the very content you address in your podcast. (Tip: Google Keyword planner — a free Google Ads tool that you can use to search for keywords and see how a list of keywords might perform on the SEO scale!)


