FROM AIR TO AMB-OS AND BEYOND



from Jim Sanders:

Nearly 32 years ago, Ambassador launched into satellite distribution for the first time. It was November of 1987. We called our satellite department "Ambassador Inspirational Radio" or "AIR." At that time, we were mailing tens of thousands of cassettes and reelto-reel tapes. Many shipped two-day or next-day air. So it didn't take too much cyphering to figure out that satellite delivery would save everyone time and money.

And it did.

We operated two discrete stereo channels delivering pre-recorded and live content in both mono and stereo. We used 14 Otari ARS-1000 reel-toreel machines, an IGM Go-Cart 24 and a very rudimentary computer. That "computer" probably didn't have enough horsepower at the time to play a decent game of Solitaire.

Because store-forward computers weren't around, we transmitted Focus on the Family on the hour and half hour five days per week. A station carrying Focus needed to do nothing more than simply pot up the right AIR receiver.

Of course, back then, everything was real time and analog. A proliferation of receiver and demodulation cards gave rise to the advent of the Christian Radio Consortium (CRC) around 2000. Wegener's Unity4000® was the platform of choice. We rapidly realized multiple feeds each day was inefficient. So when IP delivery (Amb-OS AMR-100) came around, it only made sense to increase our efficiency and reliability at no charge to stations.

Today, we carry more live content than ever. We also deliver about 1,500 hours of programming each month, about twice the number of hours in a given month. We do this because of speed. Amb-OS sends files in about one sixth the length of a program. For example, a 60-second feature takes less than 10

seconds to send.

It's amazing to realize where the Lord has taken us with such a strong support team of developers. It's fun to reminisce. But I've come to realize those WEREN'T "the good old days," THESE are the good old days!

You know I love the quote which has been attributed to many different people which says, "When your memories exceed your dreams, the end is near."

We continue to dream. There are great days ahead. The AMR-200 is on the horizon and we have plans to expand its capability. We're doing more live program delivery than ever. Our job now is to remain faithful to the task the Lord has at hand. To gently press forward in the way He's set our dreams.

Thank you for your partnership in that effort.








RADIO MISSION TO HAITI

And speaking of generosity, the second piece of financial wisdom comes from Proverbs 11:24. In The Message, it reads: "The world of the generous gets larger and larger; the world of the stingy gets smaller and smaller." For me, it can be easy to let a scarcity mentality dictate my approach to money. But really, God has shown himself to be a God of abundance. He cares and provides for us. Starting to live my life with a mindset of generosity - with money, time and talents has brought so much joy and contentment to my life. And it's brought new friendships and opportunities, too, making my world larger, just like the writer of Proverbs says.

You and Ryan have been married 13 years—where did you meet ... and what first attracted you to him? We met at church. At the end of our young adults Sunday School class, we had to pair up and pray with someone. Ryan and I were the last two left unpaired, so we prayed together. When I walked away, I thought, "I think that's the guy I'm going to marry!" which was a little startling. But God knew what He was doing and the rest is history. We dated for six months, got engaged, and got married six months later. I was

attracted to his demeanor — he's a deep thinker and very caring. He was clearly committed to discovering what it means to practically live out one's faith every day.

Tell us one thing about each of your remarkable kids ©. Oh boy. Glad you limited it to one thing! © Every time we've had a new baby, I've been surprised that they could be so different from the others before them. Olive is our oldest, and she is 9-going-on-50. She is a take-charge kind of girl, and she is a tremendous help! Delia is our 7-year-old self-proclaimed "tenderheart." When one of her siblings is upset or in trouble, Delia starts to empathetically cry. She is as sweet as they come. Seth is our 5-year-old, and he's mischievous. He loves to tease and joke around. And our baby, Abe, is a charmer. I'm treasuring every milestone with him.

What does the Briese family enjoy doing most when you have time together?
Well, three of the four kids are playing soccer this year, so it feels like our second home is the soccer field.


