DID YOU KNOW?

Closed for winter! The only national park for which that's true is Michigan's **Isle Royale National Park**, covering the entirety of a 45-mile-long island in Lake Superior. One reason that the island fully closes every November 1-April 15 is that the frigid conditions of Lake Superior make it too dangerous for visitors. The island is accessible only by boat or seaplane, and all wheeled vehicles (even bicycles) are banned. The pristine backcountry is worth the journey for hikers and campers who want to explore unspoiled wilderness and share the trails with the island's resident moose and wolves.
