## DID YOU KNOW? Central park edition

- If you ever get turned around in the 840 acres of New York City's Central Park, just ask directions from one of its 1,600 lampposts. On each of these posts is a secret code that serves as a navigation system around the massive park. But don't worry – it doesn't take a genius to crack the code. There are four numbers on each "luminaire," the first two identifying the nearest cross street, and the second two indicating the direction the park is nearest (even numbers for east, odd for west). The larger the second number is, the closer to the center of the park you are.
- Central Park was built at a cost of \$7.39 million and around 1,600 residents were moved to make way for the park. More than 20,000 people contributed to the construction.
- Central Park is actually **bigger than two countries**—Monaco (499 acres) and Vatican City (109 acres).
