- While Minnesota is the "Land of 10,000 Lakes," Oregon is home to the deepest lake in the USA —**Crater Lake**, like the name suggests, resides in the crater left behind by the collapsed volcano Mount Mazama. And although no rivers are running into it, the lake has a staggering depth of 1,949 feet. All of the water comes from rain and snowmelt and replaces itself roughly every 250 years.
- If you love cheese, you're probably a fan of Tillamook. **The Tillamook Creamery** is the largest cheese factory in the world, and over one million people a year visit and eat all the dairy products they can handle. Over 80 farms contribute to and benefit from this wonderful system.
- When you jump out of your car in Oregon to **pump gas**, you'll be asked to get back in your vehicle and let an attendant take care of it. That's right — it's actually against the law to pump your own gas.
