National Radio Day! Today celebrates the invention of the radio and its importance to mass communication. John MacArthur of *Grace to You* recently said, "radio is still viable and in high demand," and we would suspect *you* agree!

DID YOU KNOW?

- **National Honey Bee Day** is August 21st! Honey Bees are responsible for over 1/3 of the food we eat. The queen bee can live up to five years. She is busiest in the summer months, when she can lay up to 2,500 eggs a day!
- Ray Bradbury wrote **Fahrenheit 451** in the basement of UCLA's Powell Library-on a typewriter that he rented for ten cents per half hour. He completed the story in nine days.
- **KDKA** in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania was the world's first commercial radio station.
- Italian inventor and engineer **Guglielmo Marconi** is the "father of radio." He developed and demonstrated the first successful long-distance wireless telegraph and in 1901, broadcasted the first transatlantic radio signal. Marconi radios ended the isolation of ocean travel and saved hundreds of lives, including all of the surviving passengers from the sinking Titanic. In 1909, he shared the Nobel Prize in Physics for his radio work.
