LIFE ISSUES (9/10)


Taking every opportunity to affirm that human life is sacred, **Brad Mattes** reflects on the events of 9/11 with gratitude that He is our strong tower.







Celebrating 20 Years for Revive Our Hearts

An outgrowth of a unique partnership in ministry, *Revive Our Hearts* aired its first program on September 3, 2001, as a successor to the *Gateway to Joy* broadcast with Elisabeth Elliot.

The intervening years have evidenced an extraordinary response to the clear teaching of God's Word that "calls women to freedom, fullness, and fruitfulness in Christ."

Today, Revive Our Hearts (expanded in 2006 from the original 15-minute daily to a full 30-minute program) is heard on over 800 outlets across the country, companioned by a growing international broadcast endeavor as well. Also aired daily is the 1:00 feature, Seeking Him. And, this year saw the launch of Revive Our Hearts Weekend anchored by Dannah Gresh.

The scope of the ministry continues to grow through a robust roster of videocasts and podcasts including the weekly *Grounded* release with Erin Davis and Dannah Gresh. The library of *Revive Our Hearts* resources continues to expand as well.

In addition to audio, video, and print, the ministry has hosted the *True Woman* gathering for a number of years, inviting thousands of women to these life-changing events for personal revival and embracing biblical womanhood.

ONE MORE GOODBYE

Normally, the word "sunset" means a wonderful description of a night sky on fire with lavish red, yellow and orange hues. It's a wonderful time of day. Work is done. Sleep is just around the corner. It's my favorite time of day.

But for software support, "sunset" typically generates a certain amount of panic. It usually means the end of support for a trusted piece of software or hardware is around the corner. It's a signal that you're going to have to find another mousetrap to solve a problem. Could mean you need to install a whole new operating system.

Well, at Amb-OS Media, we're announcing the "sunsetting" of our support for the Windows XP version of our User Interface (UI). Effective November 1, 2021, support for our UI running on XP will end. Let me be quick to add . . . if you're currently running our UI on XP, the software will continue to work. However, below are three reasons to update your computer's OS:

- It's vulnerable. Microsoft ended support for XP seven years ago, April 8, 2014. There are a litany of well-known security flaws which often are the vector of XP attacks. It's just not safe these days. Continued use of XP leaves your station vulnerable to unpatched security issues. In July 2021 alone, Microsoft patched 117 flaw, nine of which were "zero-days" and four of those being active in the wild.
- 2. It's old! Windows XP landed in the commercial marketplace 20 years ago, Fall of 2001. Since XP, there have been five new versions of the Windows OS for consumers: Windows Vista, 7, 8, 10, 11. So it's time. Actually, it's overtime to

- upgrade to a modern and more secure version of Windows.
- It's lacking features. New features (like customization and name changes) our UI offers can't be added to the XP platform. Remaining on XP doesn't allow us to deploy the latest features of our UI.


There are about 100 station partners who continue to have an XP machine running our UI. If you need help in migrating to a new computer, please give us a call (877-262-6728). You can export your UI settings and easily import them on your new Windows OS in a matter of a few minutes.

See, waving goodbye isn't all that painful, after all!





Actually, the commitment to marriage is always clear as **Jim Daly**, president of *Focus on the Family*, is heard daily on the iconic broadcast. His partner in life, **Jean**, shares that passion and is also a strong advocate for children in foster care, volunteering her time in such work as well as serving in the local church. The family (which includes two young-adult sons) enjoys hiking and "glamping"—and, apparently, eating very tasty food!

PRIME TIME

Cheesy Chicken & Ham Bundles

JIM & JEAN DALY



Makes 6 servings

3 whole boneless/skinless chicken breasts, split (1/2 breast for each bundle)

3 chicken bouillon cubes dissolved in 2½ cups hot water (or use chicken stock)

6 tablespoons prepared mustard

34 teaspoon garlic salt

3/4 teaspoon fines herbes (or 1/4 teaspoon each sage leaves, dry basil and thyme)

6 large slices (4x6-inch) jack cheese

6 large slices (4x6-inch) cooked ham

1 package (10 ounces) frozen pastry sheets

1 egg white, beaten

Poppy or sesame seeds (optional)

I knew exactly the recipe that fits "family favorite" for the Daly tribe. In fact, Jean still has the page out of Sunset magazine that her mom first used to begin a great tradition of enjoying this meal. The publication may now be defunct, but the recipe lives on!

Place chicken breasts in a 3-quart saucepan; pour the bouillon broth or chicken stock on top. Use enough water to cover the chicken. Bring to boiling, reduce heat; cover and simmer for 20 minutes or until tender. Let cool in broth 30 minutes; remove from broth and refrigerate chicken to cool completely.

Mix together the mustard, garlic salt and fines herbes until blended. Spread 1 tablespoon of the mixture over each piece of chicken, coating thoroughly. Wrap a slice of the cheese, then a slice of ham around each piece.

Let pastry sheets stand at room temperature 30 minutes. Cut the pastry sheet into 6 triangles. On a lightly floured board, roll each sheet into an 8-inch circle. Set a piece of the wrapped chicken, seam side down, in center of pastry circle. Bring up sides of pastry to overlap in center; moisten with drops of warm water and pinch to seal. Lightly spray a baking sheet with cooking spray. Place bundles seam side down, on the baking sheet at least 2 inches apart. Brush with egg white; sprinkle with seeds if desired. Chill 30 minutes before baking, for best results.

Place in a 425° oven and bake for 20 minutes or until lightly browned. Cool 15 minutes on rack. Serve warm or refrigerate to cool completely and serve cold.
