DID YOU KNOW?

• President **William Howard Taft** is the only President to have also served on the **Supreme Court**. He left the White House in 1913 after one term as President and reemerged in 1921 as Chief Justice – a position he held until 1930.

• **The first official baseball game** was played on June 19, 1846, when the Knickerbockers took on the New York Nine at Elysian Fields in Hoboken, New Jersey. It was a blow-out, with the New York Nine winning 23-1 in four innings. **Elysian Fields** holds a special place in Greek mythology as the final resting place of the heroic dead, and the name similarly holds a place of distinction in the mythology of America's favorite pastime.

• **Rhode Island** covers only 1,214 square miles, but it's home to more than 1 million people – giving it a larger population than some much geographically bigger states, such as Alaska and Wyoming.
