### MONDAY 11/1

The ceiling of the *Sistine Chapel* in Rome, one of Michelangelo's most famous works, was exhibited to the public for the first time in 1512. He spent 4 years working on the masterpiece!

### TUESDAY 11/2

In 1920, KDKA in Pittsburgh made the nation's *first commercial broadcast*. It was election day, and people could hear the results of the Harding-Cox presidential race before it was in the newspaper.

### WEDNESDAY 11/3

The film *The Wizard of Oz* aired on television for the first time in 1956. It was seen by an estimated 45 million viewers; its repeated airings on TV helped make the movie an enduring classic.

### FRIDAY 11/5

## DID YOU KNOW?

- In Hawaii, the **Dole Plantation's** giant pineapple garden maze was declared the world's largest in 2008 by the **Guinness Book of World Records**, and is one of only a few permanent botanical mazes in the United States.
- In *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz* book series, **Dorothy's shoes were made of silver**. However, the screenwriter recommended the slippers be changed to ruby for the film due to the fact that the **bright red** hue would show up much better against the yellow brick road.
- November's birth flower is the **chrysanthemum**. Generally, chrysanthemums represent cheerfulness. A red one conveys "I love you." White symbolizes truth or pure love. A yellow one indicates slighted love.
