DID YOU KNOW?

• Veterans Day was originally known as Armistice Day. Although WWI had officially ended, the fighting did not cease until an armistice was put into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. It later became Veterans Day, a day to honor all American veterans.

• The theme for **Veterans Day 2021** is centered on the centennial commemoration of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Located at Arlington National Cemetery, the Tomb was initially dedicated on Armistice Day, November 11, 1921, with the burial of an unknown service member from World War I.

• Benjamin Franklin designed a musical instrument used by Mozart and Beethoven. The "**glass armonica**," an instrument designed to replicate the otherworldly sound that a wet finger makes when rubbed along the rim of a glass.
