DID YOU KNOW?

- In the 1930s, a proposal for the 49th state (at the time) combined 23 Oklahoma counties and 46 Texan counties into **Texlahoma**, with the capital in Amarillo. Residents believed that having their own statehood and legislature would give them better access to improved infrastructure and services. The idea even earned the support of then-Vice President John Nance Garner, but the plan was dropped.
- The cupcake was originally known as the 1-2-3-4 cake because the recipe called for 1 cup of butter, 2 cups of sugar, 3 cups of flour, 4 eggs, and also 1 cup of milk, and 1 spoonful of baking soda.
- In 2013, the Guinness World Records awarded a club in Texas for having the world's largest gingerbread house. This house amounted to 35,823,400 calories and it was big enough to comfortably house a family of five.
- Bing Crosby's version of "White Christmas" is the highest-selling single of all time.
