MONDAY 4/4

TUESDAY 4/5

300 years ago today, Jacob Roggeveen became the first European to discover Easter Island. Prior to the arrival on Easter Sunday, 1722, the island's indigenous Rapa Nui were the only people on the island.

WEDNESDAY 4/6

On April 6, 1909, American explorers Matthew Henson and Robert Peary, reached the North Pole and are believed to be the first group to do so. Henson was the first member to stand on the official pole.

THURSDAY 4/7

The first Thursday of April is marked as National Burrito Day! While not an officially recognized holiday, many fast food restaurants celebrate the day and the tortilla wrapped delicacy.

FRIDAY 4/8

On this day in 1904, Mayor George McClellan renamed Longacre Square in New York to Times Square for the proud newspaper that had just relocated to the block.

DID YOU KNOW?

- The animal dubbed most dangerous in the Grand Canyon is the rock squirrel. The creatures may be cute, but they can also be aggressive, especially when visitors are unnecessarily invading their space.
- The etymology behind the word "April" comes from the verb "aperire," which means "to open." It's believed that the word refers to the season of trees and flowers beginning to "open" or bloom.
- When coffee first arrived in Venice. **Italy**, in 1615, it was incredibly controversial. People were afraid of the color, the taste, and the effects. It was so feared that locals said it was a "bitter invention of Satan." They asked Pope Clement VIII to get rid of it. Instead, he tried it and loved it, giving it official papal approval.
- Two of the largest gatherings in **Times Square** were on 8/15/45 when the crowd marked the end of WW2, and for the 1999 millennium celebration on New Year's Eve.
