MONDAY 7/4

Life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness--the ideals we celebrate on July 4th. Today in 1776, *the colonies approved the Declaration of Independence*, a formal statement self-claiming America's separation from Britain.

Let freedom ring! On July 4th we heard fireworks, but on this day in 1776, *Philadelphians heard the tolling of the Liberty Bell*. This famous brass alarm signified a public reading of the newly published Declaration of Independence.

DID YOU KNOW?

- **General Sherman** is a giant sequoia tree located in the Giant Forest of Sequoia National Park in Tulare County, in the U.S. state of California. By volume, it is the largest known living single-stem tree on earth. However, the honor of the tallest tree in the world is bestowed upon **Hyperion**, a **379-foot-tall redwood** also located in California.
 - The first published recipe for s'mores was in a 1927 publication called **Tramping and Trailing with the Girl Scouts**. Loretta Scott Crew, who made them for Girl Scouts by the campfire, is given credit for inventing the recipe.
 - **Yogi Berra** holds the record for the most World Series appearances, and the record for most World Series wins.
 - The Liberty Bell was originally known as the **State House Bell**. In the late 1830s, it acquired the name of the Liberty Bell when it became a symbol of the anti-slavery movement.
