MONDAY 11/28

The *Grand Ole Opry* began broadcasting live from Nashville, Tennessee in 1925. Originally named the Barn Dance after a Chicago radio program, the showcase featured country-western and folk music.

TUESDAY 11/29

Every year, the Tuesday after Thanksgiving is set aside for the global generosity movement, *Giving Tuesday*. It's a great opportunity to help those in need by donating to your favorite charity!

WEDNESDAY 11/30

Starting in 1931, the famous *Rockefeller Center Christmas tree* had a humble beginning with a 20ft balsam fir. Now, the Center boasts an 82ft tall Norway Spruce from the New York town of Queensbury.

THURSDAY 12/1

What better way to get into the holiday spirit than with *Peppermint Bark Day*! Williams Sonoma's founder, Chuck Williams, invented this seasonal treat in 1998 which takes more than 24hrs from start to finish to complete.

FRIDAY 12/2

Born today in 1859, *Georges Seurat* would become the founder of the school of Neo-Impressionism which involves Pointillism. This technique uses thousands of tiny dots of paint to complete a full image.

DID YOU KNOW?

- **Richard Nixon is the only president to ever perform at the Grand Ole Opry.** When the Opry moved from the Ryman Auditorium to its "new" home at Opry House in 1974, Mr. Nixon came to Nashville.
 - With television becoming a household standard, the Rockefeller Center Christmas tree tradition received **national coverage via the NBC company for the first time in 1951.**
 - The most popular Christmas tree variety is the **balsam fir** and it's also the most fragrant. They're durable and have short, flat, dark green needles.
 - Georges Seurat's most famous painting is **A Sunday on La Grande Jatte** (1884-1886). The painting is located at The Art Institute of Chicago in Chicago's Grant Park.
