MONDAY 3/6

The Battle of the Alamo finally concluded after 13 days of battle. Almost 200 members of the voluntary Texan army, including Davy Crockett, perished during the fort's siege. Several days later, Sam Houston's forces led Texas to a victorious battle with the cry, "remember the Alamo!"

TUESDAY 3/7

"The woods are lovely, dark and deep." Today in 1923 Robert Frost's **Stopping by Woods on a Snowy Evening is published**. Frost published his first book in 1913 and eventually gave lectures at Harvard and Dartmouth, even reading his poetry at President Kennedy's inauguration.

WEDNESDAY 3/8

The Beatles BBC first radio debut was broadcast today in 1962. Recorded the day earlier, the band performed three versions of covers of 'Dream Baby (How Long Must I Dream?)' for the show Teenager's Turn – Here We Go.

THURSDAY 3/9

What's your favorite type of **popcorn**? Buttered, caramel corn, cheesy, or maybe a mixture of both? The first microwavable popcorn wasn't invented until the 70's, when more people were staying home to watch movies and television, but still wanted that classic movie treat.

FRIDAY 3/10

Today, we honor and remember Harriet Tubman, a courageous woman who worked relentlessly to help other slaves escape to freedom. George Bush, the president at the time, declared **Harriet Tubman Day** a national holiday in 1990.
