Celebrations erupted across Europe and the US today in 1945 as the world rejoiced that German forces in Europe had finally laid down their weapons. Communities came together to hold parades, parties and events including ten consecutive services from London's St. Paul Cathedral with thousands of people attending.

TUESDAY 5/9

It wasn't until Woodrow Wilson lobbied Congress today in 1914, that the Mother's Day holiday became official. Wilson said in his first Mother's Day proclamation that the day provided an opportunity to "[publicly express] our love and reverence for the mothers of our country.'

WEDNESDAY 5/10

Originally, golf was played with a ball made of feathers and clubs carved from wood. The first recorded game was played in 1457 in the town of St. Andrews. Golf has clearly changed dramatically, but what hasn't changed is how popular it is. Happy National Golf Day!

THURSDAY 5/11

Garry Kasparov, a chess Grandmaster, resigned from a match against Deep Blue, a chess-playing computer developed by IBM, after only 19 moves. Kasparov explained his resignation by saying that he had simply lost his fighting spirit.

DID YOU KNOW?

- The announcement that the war had ended in Europe was broadcast to the British people over the radio late in the day on 7 May 1945. The BBC interrupted its scheduled programming with the news that Victory in Europe Day would be a national holiday, to take place the following day.
- Some attribute the origins of Mother's Day, celebrated on the 14th this year, to American author Julia Ward Howe in 1872. Others say it was activist Anna Jarvis in 1907 who first established the holiday.
- Historians generally agree that golf as we know it today originated in Scotland in the 15th century.
- Deep Blue, IBM's chess-playing computer, had the ability to calculate around **100 billion** moves within the threeminute time frame given to each player for their move in standard chess.
