Always Giving Thanks

Steve Reinke has been a vital part of the development of Amb-OS and

the Christian Radio Consortium (CRC) since they were both just an idea on a whiteboard. He's led the Focus Satellite Network team for nearly 30 years, since just after joining the ministry.



He came to Christ as a 10-year-old child in South Dakota, being raised by a newly singled mother. He attended one of Child Evangelism Fellowship's Good News Clubs and it was there he heard and responded to the gospel. His spiritual growth eventually led him to attend Grace Bible Institute (GBI), earning his Bachelor's there, and later an MDiv from Knox Theological Seminary. GBI is where Steve met his wife, Betty. In fact, they married and graduated on the same day! Then, just a year later, their son Michael was born.

KGBI-FM was the first radio job Steve held, performing both announcing and engineering support. The Lord led Steve and Betty to Colorado Springs where he taught repair and electronics. Then, an opportunity at Focus on the Family opened in 1996 which suited perfectly his knowledge and abilities combining radio and technical support. That started his lengthy career at Focus.



The Reinkes are deeply committed to their church and ministry in Mexico. They've made more than 22 trips, logging more than 55,000 miles and building 40 houses, 1 school and 3 churches. The objective has been to instill a heart for missions in teenagers at the church along with building homes for the needy. Additionally, both at church and in seminary, Steve has been teaching Bible for about 35 years.

Life's path took a turn for the Reinkes when in 2016, their son Michael passed away suddenly, leaving his wife Molly and two young children, Elsie (10) and Adelaide (8). Steve and Betty adore their young granddaughters, remaining actively involved in their lives.



Today, Steve faces his greatest battle yet having been diagnosed with Anaplastic Thyroid Cancer, a rare and aggressive form of the disease. ATC is especially pernicious with a very low survival rate. His cancer has spread to his bones, liver and lungs. But the Lord has provided some wonderful medical workers and is undergoing a special, targeted chemotherapy.

So pray for Steve. Fervently. Persistently. Add him to your prayer list. He's been a faithful servant of the Lord and a vital leader in the Christian broadcast community, for which we are deeply thankful.








TAKING THE STAGE AT NRB

BTW—since we haven't posted out of the Ambassador Family Cookbook for some time, we're taking the space to share this good recipe which is "cobbled together" from several sources. If you grew up eating Tamale Pie as some of us did, we think you'll like this!

FROM OUR KITCHEN

PRIME TIME

Tamale Pie



1 box corn muffin mix (such as JIFFY)

1 large egg

1/2 c. sour cream

1/2 can of creamed corn

1 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil

1 onion, chopped

1 tsp. ground cumin

1 tsp. chili powder

Kosher salt

Freshly ground black pepper

2 cloves garlic, minced

1 lb. ground beef

1/3 c. red enchilada sauce

1 c. shredded cheddar cheese

1 c. shredded Monterey jack cheese

1 can sliced black olives

½ c. golden raisins

Preheat oven to 400°. Grease a large oven-safe skillet with cooking spray. In a large bowl, whisk together corn muffin mix, egg, sour cream, and creamed corn. Transfer to prepared skillet and bake until golden, 20 minutes. Let cool.

Meanwhile, in a large skillet over medium heat, heat oil. Add onion, cumin, and chili powder and season with salt and pepper. Cook until soft, 5 minutes. Add garlic and cook until fragrant, 1 minute more. Add ground beef and cook, breaking up meat with a wooden spoon, until no longer pink, about 6 minutes. Drain fat.

Poke entire surface of cornbread with a fork and pour over enchilada sauce. Add beef and top with cheeses.

Cover with foil and bake until cheese is melted, about 20 minutes. Switch oven to broil, remove foil, and broil until cheese turns golden, about 5 minutes.
