- With more than 50,000 estimated casualties, the Battle of Gettysburg was the bloodiest single battle.
- In 1781. Massachusetts became the first state to declare the 4th of July an official state holiday.
- What are some other names for mechanical pencils in the world? In the UK they're called **propelling pencils** and pen pencils in India.
- Up until the early 1900s, **fried chicken** was a dish that was usually reserved for special occasions and holidays, due to the scarcity of spring chickens and the need for such a high volume of fat.
- Pre-sliced bread was banned in the United States briefly in 1943 as a wartime conservation effort. The ban was intended to save two things: the wax paper used for preserving sliced bread and the steel used in slicing machines.
