DID YOU KNOW?

- Though it is one of the most famous and widely celebrated speeches in U.S. history, the "I Have a Dream" speech is not in the public domain, but is protected by copyright which is owned and enforced by King's heirs.
- The National Hurricane Center originated the name lists for storms in 1953. Only women's names were used until 1979, when the lists began alternating women's and men's names.
- The Baseball Hall of Fame is comprised of 342 elected members. Included are 270 former major league players, 40 executives/pioneers, 22 managers and 10 umpires.
- The Liberty Bell is composed of approximately 70 percent copper, 25 percent tin and traces of lead, zinc, arsenic, gold and silver.
- As the death toll from the most current natural disaster rises, prayers continue for Lahaina, Hawaii and the impact of the deadliest U.S. wildfire in more than century.
