## THE LATEST FROM AMB-OS

Did you hear about the new Artificial Intelligence program for farmers? It's called "A-I-A-I-O."

Love that dad joke. It softens the oft-heard gloom and doom from a chorus of Skynet-fearing luddites.

In the end, they very well may be right. But in the interim, **there is an increasing array of fascinating applications which may actually be of use.** I have a friend who



welcomed the technology by using ChatGPT to write up performance reviews of his direct reports. The boss, who later reviewed the evaluations, said they were the "best ever." I'm not surprised. (If you haven't yet tried ChatGPT, it's worth a few minutes to grasp and stand gob-smacked at the power of this hair-raising tool.)

This really isn't news. We've long known that computers are far more capable than humans at doing detailed and repetitive tasks without interruption. But very few saw it coming: that a computer's "cognitive skills" would border the bizarre.

The recording industry is a great case in point. Through the years, I've often been asked if I can "Do anything with this recording." Analog, even digital, signal processing often does more damage than good in trying to fix an audio file. Current audio repair technology was pretty much limited to removing record scratches, ground hums, or leakage from an adjacent studio mike. What you got is what you get—nothing anyone could do.

No more. The "new" recording from The Beatles, "Now and Then" proves the case. The technology is jaw-dropping. While there's a 12-minute version of "The Making Of," music reviewer Rick Beato has a shorter explanation and demonstration of the software. Let Google be your friend here . . . you'll find it. Or better yet, check out the "making of" movie of this "new" Beatles song. (tinyurl.com/bdf2m3uz)

The point is, **AI seems to now make anything possible** including a new song from a Beatle who's been gone for more than 40 years. It leaves you with a profound sense that we have no clue as to what AI will allow us to do in every industry, but especially for those of us in the broadcast world. Reminds me of those who envisioned radio being used by God to reach the "Field white unto harvest." May we have wisdom and insight in navigating these new waters.

# Celebrating Sanctity of Life Sunday - January 21 -



For many Americans, the argument for abortion often lands on the topic of rape—shouldn't abortion be allowed in such difficult situations?



In this year's all-new special programming created in conjunction with Sanctity of Life Sunday (and the annual March for Life in Washington DC), host **Brad Mattes** answers the concern with a powerful reminder of the value of every human life.

Joining Brad, President of Life Issues Institute, are two guests who speak eloquently out of personal experience (see sidebar).

A veteran in the pro-life movement, Brad has a Master's degree in Biblical Studies and Biblical Counseling. He has a particular heart for fathers of aborted children and often counsels those in such grief.

Every weekday, Brad Mattes speaks on behalf of the sacred gift of life in the popular 1:00 feature "Life Issues." For more than 30 years, the half-hour program (initially featuring the voice of pro-life leader Dr. John Willke) has provided timely perspective on the most current concerns threatening the sanctity of life.

To help provide more in-depth insight on contemporary cultural issues, a new long-form weekend broadcast launched last year. Titled "Straight Talk on Life Issues," the program is anchored by Brad Mattes with co-host Victor Nieves who provides a strong pro-life view from the 20-something age bracket.

"The circumstances of my conception do not determine my worth as a human being."

#### Ayala Isenberg

When Ayala was a child, she was repeatedly sexually abused for years. When she was 15 years old, she became pregnant through rape. Amazingly, despite the tragedy in conception, Ayala actually felt love for the child and fought to keep it. Sadly, she miscarried and lost her daughter. Now Ayala is a powerful advocate for life with a significant presence on social media where she vigorously defends the truth that every life is sacred.

# **Reflection from the Ambassador Team**

One of the first things I do when I walk into someone's office is ... take a look at what fills their shelves. What are the book titles? Who is in the pictures? Where did that little giraffe come from? <sup>1</sup> I guess my personal curiosity is what prompted me to try to share some glimpses into "shelves" of the speakers we serve—especially after reading a fascinating NY Times piece about just that.

# I got to thinking that maybe I ought to share my own "shelf life" as I ask others to do the same ... so here you go!

**I** Truth be told, I have a lot of shelves 😊 . I love being surrounded by books. Have I read them all? Uh, no. I confess. Check out the Japanese word *tsundoku* ... that's me.

There are shelves of books authored by the men and women we've been so privileged to serve over the decades of Ambassador's life. There are shelves of biography, history, hymn books, devotional, even children's books. But this is what I look at as I sit at my home desk each morning for devotions:

The bottom shelf includes several volumes from my childhood including the Bible storybook that the Sanders family used every night after dinnertime. A treasure.

The second shelf features books of art, especially exhibit publications that delight me as does the memory of seeing those images in person. In the middle of that shelf, though, is a framed card (front and back) that was hand-painted by Timothy Botts and sent to me and my husband when Jon was in the last of his battle with cancer. It reads: *I never realized that broken glass could shine so brightly.* 

On the third shelf is evidence that I'm a dog person! (Obviously, if you look hard, you'll quickly see that Scottish Terriers are top of the list.) On that shelf is also a quote from Eleanor Roosevelt which I first discovered on a 2005 quotation calendar just a few days after Jon's earthly life ended. *"You must do the thing you think you cannot do."* I have reminded myself of that, alongside Philippians 4:19, many times since.

At the top are some of the Christian classics—from "How Shall We Then Live" to "Purpose-Driven Life." And a reminder of my dozen years at Azusa Pacific University—a greatly rewarding experience.

#### Did you know?

"Books: Everyone's got them. That is, except 9% of Americans. A survey from YouGov found that almost 1 in 10 Americans *does not own* a single physical book. On the other hand, 3% of Americans own *more than 1,000 books*, a group we assume is mostly made up of kooky college professors and Rory Gilmore wannabes. And while nearly a third of Americans don't organize their bookshelves at all, those who do are most likely to sort by genre (22%). Only 10% sort by author, and even fewer (3%) arrange by color."
