### THE LATEST FROM AMB-OS



Our brand new AMR-200's are rolling out the door! For those who will be receiving this new receiver, here's a bit of information about what you'll be using.



The **AMR-100** receiver was "design-built." There was very little "off-the-shelf" in our first receiver. It uses a proprietary operating system with specialized permissioning that keeps the system secure. The 100 also does not have a fan in the box as there really is nothing to keep cool and only one moving part: the spinning hard drive.

In contrast, the **AMR-200**'s are sourced from an off-the-shelf 1RU PC frame. They run a version of Linux which has been carefully locked down securely.

With this second-generation receiver, there are a number of new features on the AMR-200 which come with a ubiquitous PC box. Some in use, others not. Here's an overview of the receiver's "working end":

- Male XLR connectors for Channel 1 & 2 balanced analogue line-level outputs
- AES Digital also appears for each channel on male XLR connectors
- DB9 (Female) connector is used for relay closures; this is where GPIO in/out is found
- The RF-Connector is for LNB input and to send power to the feedhorn
- You'll find three standard mini PC jacks (3.5mm) for mic in, analog in and line out
- Dual NIC cards and four USB ports
- Two RS232 (Male DB9) ports for signaling and one (Male DB9) port for alarm conditions
- There's an HDMI monitor port
- Reset button

This receiver, like its predecessor, can obtain files via satellite, the Internet, or both. In fact, if there's an interruption of the satellite signal to any given receiver, the receiver will back-fill the file with missing packets off the Internet. This is why we say an Internet connection is a necessity—the whole system works without any intervention if both satellite and Internet are connected.

Then lastly, perhaps the best news: our User Interface, which is at the heart of Amb-OS, is the same software for either receiver. Configuring one or more copies of the software on your network is a simple task and they can share a common receiver.

### A WORD FROM THE NRB CHAIRMAN

# A Reminder of the Value of NRB

At this year's NRB Membership meeting, **Jim Sanders** shared the following encouragement. Since many may not have heard the message in person, we want to share with you in our NRB coverage.

If you'll indulge me for about 7 minutes, I want to start by reading to you the first sentence of a beautifully written Gettysburg address:

"Standing beneath this serene sky, overlooking these broad fields now reposing from the labors of the waning year, the mighty Alleghenies dimly towering before us, the graves of our brethren beneath our feet, it is with hesitation that I raise my poor voice to break the eloquent silence of God and Nature." (Yeah, that's one sentence!)

Now you may think that doesn't sound like the opening of the Gettysburg address, but it is. The opening of the first of **two** Gettysburg speeches.

Those words came from famed orator **Edward Everett** at the dedication in 1863. Everett's speech continued for a little while longer. To be exact, another **two** hours. Lincoln, who spoke next, was on stage for less than two minutes.

You may have memorized Lincoln's iconic speech as a grade-schooler. His powerful words are permanently inscribed on the wall of the Lincoln memorial just as they are in many of our minds.



Lincoln thought the speech a failure. Little did he know how his 271 words would be preserved for all time.

I thought of Lincoln's remarks and his leadership after reading a superb piece in the *Harvard Business Review* which I want to share with you today. The focus was on the four attributes which set successful CEO's apart. It's quite fascinating.

And Lincoln certainly epitomized these attributes. So it seemed fitting to share these qualities with you since there are so many who are or will be C-Suite executives in this room. And I promise to take less than two hours to do so.

This work comes from a 10-year study known as the CEO Genome project. They looked at 17,000 executives with more than 2,000 of which were CEO's.

And interestingly, they found the best CEO's weren't ivy-league educated. IQ wasn't a factor. Good looks and the ability to speak weren't vital components. But there were **four** simple characteristics which made all the difference in them and I think they can in you and me.

#### The first is the ability to decide with speed and conviction.

Being decisive is far more important than being right. Successful CEO's make decisions earlier, faster, and with greater conviction. Good CEOs recognize that a wrong decision may be better than no decision at all. As Elon Musk has demonstrated the "fail quickly and recover quickly" style of operation.

Then, **secondly, high performing CEO's engage for impact**. They focus on understanding the core strengths of an organization and can effectively communicate it everywhere, particularly for non-profits to constituents. They bring others in on the plan, even dissenters as Lincoln did, with his team of rivals as Doris Kearns Goodwin called them, and including them in decisions along the way.

Proverbs promises, "there is wisdom in the counsel of many." There's no better place to have an ear to the rail of the future than NRB where wisdom is in ample supply.

**Third, high performing CEO's adapt proactively**. They anticipate change and scour a broad range of information flows, even from unrelated businesses. And the result, in sensing change earlier, make changes in strategy to take advantage of it.

If I may say, this is such a great description of your time here and value of NRB. Scour the landscape of information in our seminars and apply it to your own ministry or business.

Then **lastly**, **high performing CEO's** *deliver reliably*. The best CEO's produce consistent results. This attribute has proven to be the most powerful for success.

**It helps to know best practices**, but where should you lead your organization? Well, the great one, Wayne Gretzky, advised to "to skate where the puck is going, not where it was."

And again, NRB is just the right place to do that! This week you'll encounter a diverse range of topics presented by industry leaders on the future in a wide variety of fields and technologies. Here are a few places to skate in our industry:

- **AI** New artificial intelligence for farmers called AI-AIO. What part should AI play in your organization's future? If you haven't yet played with ChatGPT, do so. You're in for a treat.
- **Distribution of your content** What's the best means of delivery to reach your constituents? How has it changed? Options today to deliver content are almost limitless.
- **Marketing** How do you move someone from being unaware of your work to aware and then involved?
- Attribution How do you know where your constituents want to consume your content? And what's their value?

Where should you be spending your ministry media budget?

I hardly need to remind you: we live in an upside-down world that desperately needs the Gospel. It's a world that Isaiah pointed his long bony finger and said, 'Woe to those who call evil good and good, evil" (Isaiah 5:20).

A world that says...

- Not using someone's preferred pronoun is hate speech...
- That the fetus a woman's carrying is just a blob of meaningless tissue...
- That men should be able to compete in women's athletics.

Malcolm Muggeridge was right: "The depravity of man is at once the most empirically verifiable reality but at the same time the most intellectually resisted fact."

The apostle Paul, living in an upside-down world, much like we do today, gave this charge to the Ephesian church and implicitly to us:

<sup>17</sup> Live no longer as the Gentiles do, for they are hopelessly confused. <sup>19</sup> They have no sense of shame. They live for lustful pleasure and eagerly practice every kind of impurity... <sup>22</sup> Let the Spirit renew your thoughts and attitudes. <sup>23</sup> Be kind to each other, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God through Christ has forgiven you.

Seems pretty simple to me.

Then finally, I want to circle back to Lincoln. This time to quote him from a speech given just eight months prior to the historic day at Gettysburg:

We have been preserved, these many years, in peace and prosperity. We have grown in numbers, wealth and power, as no other nation has ever grown. But we have forgotten God. We have forgotten the gracious hand which preserved us in peace, and multiplied and enriched and strengthened us; and we have vainly imagined, in the deceitfulness of our hearts, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own. Intoxicated with unbroken success, we have become too self-sufficient to feel the necessity of redeeming and preserving grace, too proud to pray to the God that made us!

May we never forget and ever acknowledge with gratitude that it is our sovereign God who makes all our efforts—and that of NRB—possible!
