
## **DID YOU KNOW?**



## Raising a New Radio Generation

We loved this report from our good friends, Floyd & Susan Turner, at Thy Word Network (Evansville IN). Maybe you're already doing the same—if not, how about taking up the challenge next summer!

66 We just finished a Radio Boot Camp with nine young people from our listening audience, introducing them to the wonderful world of Christian radio.

They learned how to compose, record and edit spots; how to do voice tracking; how to schedule programming; and how to do interviews. One day we talked about Amb-OS program delivery and the role of programmers, producers and agencies. For their final exam, we gave them a list of bullet points and info about our upcoming Sharathon. They had 15 minutes to compose three :30 promos, then we recorded



them voicing their own promo, gave it back to them to mix down on their laptops with a music bed they had made earlier. We were blown away with their creativity, and will be using their spots in the run up to Sharathon!

#### As I reflect on my school experience, interestingly enough, it was my maternal grandmother, Virginia Bell, who made the greatest impact on my learning as

a child. When she was a bride of six weeks, my grandfather, Dr. L. Nelson Bell, took her to China as a missionary where she established and ran the

women's clinic at his hospital. She was there for twenty-five years until she and my grandfather had to leave when the Japanese invaded their area.

When she returned to America, she lived in a house that was right across the street from the home where I lived with my parents for the first eight years of my life. I called her Lao Niang. She not only taught me to read so that I was very capable by the time I entered first grade, but she also taught me to love reading, which I do to this day. Sometimes the best teachers are not necessarily in a classroom.

Hands down, it was my 10th grade English teacher. Mr. Killgallon made diagramming sentences fun, gave us a thirst for English poetry, and expanded our vocabulary by at least 150 fancy words. I can still see him at the blackboard writing palatable, incongruent, and ubiquitous. Mr. K

would amble the aisles with hands clasped behind him, reciting lines from Henry V, and under him, I memorized a good chunk of Shakespeare.

Did Mr. Killgallon shape my life? Well, he sure shaped my writing. Even now, this remarkable man in his 90s composes the most elegant letters, lauding me as his all-time favorite student. I think he's got me mixed up with Marvin Levine.

One night after graduation, I had a falling-out with my dad. I stormed out and found refuge in the home of my varsity football coach, Bob Dunivant. I watched Coach and his wife and the respectful way they talked and how they related to their kids. I witnessed the same kindness, yet firmness on his

football field, and I recalled when Coach had picked me, a runt who didn't really know the game, to be his varsity starting center.

Bob was my mentor and eventually after college, I'd go back to that same school to be his assistant coach. Although he groomed me to take his place, I wasn't chosen.
