## tech updates [BY CHARLEY MEFFERD]

#### Connect with Amb-OS at NRB

It's been over a year since I joined the Amb-OS team, and I am still amazed at the capability and versatility of the Amb-OS AMR-100!



I continue to say that upgrading from traditional satellite receivers to Amb-OS is akin to upgrading in your home from an old TV/VCR combo to a modern DVR system. The difference is that stark!

With Amb-OS, no longer are stations locked into specific feed times and scheduling "netcatchers." Audio files are simply delivered in advance to the Amb-OS receivers and are then available "on demand" for the stations to play from the receiver or transfer into their automation systems. Ministries can provide customized liners, which are seamlessly integrated into audio files without requiring additional production work from their affiliates. Program producers also have the ability to swap out a program with one that has updated content at the last minute, with no extra work required from the stations.

Some smaller ministries don't use satellite at all but rely on an FTP site as their primary distribution method. But that also has its drawbacks. FTP requires stations to "fetch" programs either manually or through a software program. But if the station has an Internet outage or the computer program crashes, your broadcast doesn't air! With Amb-OS, programs are pushed to the stations using satellite and Internet, giving you and your affiliates additional redundancy.

# GET ACQUAINTED with **Ed Stetzer**

Every weekend, "BreakPoint This Week" delivers timely commentary on current events, from a biblical worldview. Meet the newest team member, Ed Stetzer (Executive Director of LifeWay Research), who joins John Stonestreet and Eric Metaxas as regular contributors.



You've just joined the team at the Colson Center. Tell us what impact Chuck Colson's legacy has had on your thinking. For me, it was Colson's articulation and embodiment of an Kuyperian worldview. In the vein of the famous Dutch theologian, Abraham Kuyper, Colson recognized how the work of the Kingdom impacts every sphere of life. That is evident in how he combined a passion for people hearing the Good News and showing the love of Jesus to the hurting, particularly his engagement in prison ministry.

You see this epitomized in the example of Jesus. In Luke 4:18-19, He talked about the poor, the marginalized, and the prisoner. But the same Jesus said He came to seek and save the lost in Luke 19:10. To see both of those things in the life and words of Chuck Colson was a beautiful combination.

Is there a new book in the pipeline? The next one will be a theological textbook that contrasts views of the mission of the church from a series of scholars. It will include Catholic, Orthodox, mainline, evangelical and progressive evangelical views. My role is to present an evangelical position on the mission of the church. It'll be out later in 2016.

As a writer that people read ... who do you read to keep percolating with ideas? There are three main spheres from which I read. First, I read a great deal on the Internet. I keep up with about 200 Christian and culture blogs. Second, I subscribe to various Christian magazines: Christianity Today, WORLD, Christian Century, Charisma, Preaching, Youth Ministry Magazine, Facts & Trends, etc. And third, I read books. Much of that is due to people asking me to endorse books, but I also read a couple of missiology books a week to keep up with the field.

However, I do want to offer an encouragement to those who feel pressure to read as much as I do. People should realize it is my job to keep up on things. This is part of my personal role. So if you're a pastor, it's better you know your people more than the latest news of the day.

As a developer of curriculum, is there an over-arching goal for the people who use the resources you create? Yes. We were stunned when The Gospel Project reached 1 million weekly users in three years. But as we evaluate its success, we think people gravitated toward it because of the values we intentionally embedded into its core. Our goal was for users to get a holistic picture of the big story of what God is doing in the world, the metanarrative: creation, fall, redemption, and restoration.

We believe all scripture points to Jesus. He is the point of the scriptures. His life, death on the cross, and resurrection, is the central event of all human history, so we keep those things central and create a study that can communicate that message for all ages. Flowing from that, we aim to consistently point to missions. We want every group that uses The Gospel Project to understand that we are to join Jesus on His mission.

How early in life did you sense this calling to share your thinking more broadly? That's a good question. Last month, someone said when I was 28 at a retreat I told him what I wanted to do. He chuckled because he said it was exactly what I was doing. I don't remember that, but I do remember an early desire to help the body of Christ be on mission.

I wanted to help churches within orthodox Christianity to live faithfully. My desire has always been to see believers show and share the love of Jesus to a broken and hurting world. In my mind, there wasn't necessarily a call to share my thinking more broadly, but to mobilize the church on mission. It just happens that those two things are related.

What would you say is your biggest concern for the Church today? Above all else, my concern is the mission force is generally not engaging the mission field. If Jesus is sending us on mission (John 20:21), we have to acknowledge we are being sent. That's the picture I don't want us to miss. We are called to join Jesus on his mission, and in doing so we will ultimately be more faithful. There are many important issues, but this is the one on which God has called me to focus my life.

You obviously speak to believers globally, but you also have a deep commitment to the local church. What excites you about body life for the local congregation today? The Church is Jesus' tool in the world; you can't love Jesus and despise his wife. That point needs to be stressed again and again.

We need to be reminded that the scriptures teach God has chosen the Church to make known His manifold wisdom. Therefore, the Church is essential to God's plan. It isn't the center of God's plan—Jesus is—but it is essential. Unfortunately, many people have deemphasized the Church's role; therefore, we need to reemphasize it. The Church is the tool of God's agenda in the world.

**Tell us about your family.** I am married to Donna, my high school sweetheart. We never dated anyone else seriously and were married at 20. We have three children — all girls, which is both a statement of awesomeness and a prayer request. They keep us exceedingly busy, as each have wonderful interests in which God has gifted them. We seek to engage those interests and pursue the Lord as a family.

What legacy do you hope to hand to your children? I want them to love Jesus and have a desire to follow Him. I want them to see their father as a follower of Jesus, imperfect, but sincere. And, ultimately, I want to know that they too will join Jesus on His mission.

I want them to have seen in me some aspects of what their Heavenly Father is like. But I also want them to have seen the truth. They should know I am not a perfect example of God the Father, but I am always seeking to be an example of a God-honoring father.
