Grace to You officially began in 1969 following John MacArthur's appointment as pastor at Grace Community Church—and the initiation of a simple tape ministry for those unable to attend services. The first tape contained the message titled "How to Play Church."



Launched in 1977, the radio ministry fueled demand for other resources—today more than 150 books, translated into more than two dozen languages. The published work of **John MacArthur** includes several study Bibles and a Commentary series covering the entire New Testament.




Today *Grace to You* is heard on stations thousands of times daily across the USA and internationally with translations on-air in Italian, Romanian, Russian and Spanish. In addition to the half-hour program, John's voice also continues to be heard daily on two short features—*Bible Q&A* and *Portraits of Grace*.

THE LATEST FROM AMB-OS



Those descriptive terms can, and do, certainly apply to the **powerful truths of Scripture**. But if I may borrow the thinking, in many ways they're also true for Amb-OS.

As intimately as I know the way Amb-OS works, I was still amazed to hear our local radio station playing a replacement program from *Grace to You* just a few hours after Dr. **John MacArthur**'s passing. Late in the evening of July 14, just a few hours after hearing the news of Dr. MacArthur going home to glory, special replacement programs were sent to stations. This **timely**—and automatic—means of updating content has been such a blessing, finding no better use than this purpose. Timeliness has been one of our Amb-OS hallmarks.

Some have asked about what happens next? Subsequent to the four weeks of special broadcasts, *Grace to You* will return to the previously scheduled **timeless** expositional studies, "unleashing God's Word, one verse at a time." That's Grace to You's commitment: to deliver the messages of John MacArthur until the Lord directs otherwise.

While "eternal" may be a bit hyperbolic, we should note this plan was determined by *Grace to You*'s leadership long ago—that the library of Bible teaching from John MacArthur will now close. Despite the potential, the ministry is determined to *never* create new material using Al or any other artificial creative technique. Friends can be assured that any teaching, video, audio or book coming from *Grace* to You, found at the ministry website, is genuine. Unfortunately there are those who have nefariously used Al-generated content to mislead consumers, often content which misrepresents Dr. MacArthur's theological perspective so this "guarantee" is significant.

We thank the Lord for Dr. John MacArthur and his commitment to the sound exposition of the Bible. And thanks to *Grace to You*, that will remain true until the Lord returns!

s this issue of *Update* arrives in mailboxes, much will have already been published (rightly so) regarding the extraordinary life and legacy of **John MacArthur**—beloved Bible teacher, author, pastor, theologian, leader in so many circles of Christian influence. While we grieve the loss of John's presence on earth, we rejoice that his voice will still be heard through the broadcast and various other streams of communication, continuing to make the truth of God's Word preeminent in our lives. May the Lord richly bless that impact long into the future!

In his own words, **John MacArthur** shares the calling that became his lifetime commitment to faithfully preaching the truth of God's Word.

hen I was still a young boy, my dad reminded me of the words of the apostle Paul: "Take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm." (Ephesians 6:13). Then he said something I'll never forget: A lot of people have said and done a lot of things, but when the smoke clears, they're not all standing. He directed me in those early years to Paul's epitaph: "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith" (2 Timothy 4:7). My father challenged me very early in my life to make that my goal.

After I had preached for more than half a century in the same church, I was often asked, "How do you have such a long, enduring ministry? What is the secret?" My answer is and always has been that I cannot take any credit for the growth of our church or the longevity of my ministry here. **God's sovereign providence has worked** in a myriad of ways (both known and unknown to me) to keep me where I am. He has done exceeding abundantly above anything I could ever ask or think.

That is not to say that I've been merely passive while the church somehow flourishes spontaneously. I have endeavored to do only one thing, and that is to focus my entire life on biblical principles, sound doctrine, and divine truth. I learned by precept and example from both my father and my grandfather that it is every pastor's duty to be unwaveringly faithful—diligent in the work of the ministry, and careful and thorough in our exposition of God's Word.

Since those early years with my dad, I have sought to be like the man in Luke's Gospel, who built his house by digging deep and laying a foundation on solid rock (Luke 6:48).

That doesn't happen because we wish it to happen, however. We don't merely speak it into existence. As Jesus said, what counts is not merely hearing or even just intellectually affirming His words, but acting on them (Luke 6:47). That is what makes a

person like the wise builder our Lord went on to describe. The blessing comes not in the knowing, but in the doing, as Jesus told His disciples in the Upper Room (John 13:17).

I've often said that if we take care of the depth of our ministry, God will take care of the breadth of it. We plant the seed of His Word and water it with our preaching and prayers, but it is God who gives the increase (1 Corinthians 3:6-7).

Still, pastors and church leaders often ask me for the "secret" to growth and longevity. Is there a program, a clever business plan, or a detailed strategy of some kind that today's church leaders should follow?

I tell them immediately: I cannot recommend any clever insights, novel approaches, or imaginative ideas that I've managed to develop. There are none. I have no innovative technique to propose. I've invented no ingenious stratagem. In fact, I have no confidence in the schemes and strategies of men—even my own. That is true especially when it comes to doing the Lord's work. Explaining a "program" for church growth and leadership is the furthest thing from my mind.

I have endeavored to do only one thing, and that is to focus my entire life on understanding, teaching, and obeying biblical principles, sound doctrine, and divine truth. While all the circumstances of life ebb and flow and the sands of human

fashions shift, the foundation I want to be building on is the bedrock of God's Word.

That conviction stems partly from another charge my father gave me. When I told him I sensed God's call on my life to be a preacher, he gave me a Bible, inscribed on the dedication page with a brief message from him: "Dear Johnny, Preach the Word. Love, Dad."

That's what his father had done with his life. That's what my dad did with his life. And it is what I have sought to do with mine.


